REGULAR MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

Supr. Lisa Moore opened the Regular Meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Led by Jon Gage

GUEST PRESENTATION ON RECYCLING

Supr. Lisa Moore introduced Kaitlynn McCumiskey of the Ontario County's Department of Sustainability & Solid Waste Management, who presented on recycling. Kaitlyn explained that their department, established in 2019, focuses on increasing sustainable materials management and waste diversion through education and funding. She noted that the local Solid Waste Management Plan draft was approved in December and submitted to DEC for review, with an upcoming presentation scheduled for April 23rd at the Phelps Community Center.

Ontario County's Materials Recovery Facility processes about 50,000 tons of material annually and currently charges \$0 per ton for county residents through a lease with Casella that ends in 2028. She detailed the facility's operations, including what materials are accepted for recycling and provided specific guidelines for different categories like plastic, paper, glass, and metal. Kaitlyn emphasized that residents should check OntarioCountyRecycles.org for the most current information and follow key rules such as keeping recycling clean and dry, not bagging materials, and avoiding contaminants like plastic bags, batteries, and small items.

The Sustainability Office also conducts recycling programs in Ontario County, including accepted materials, special collection events, and resources like the Alexa Recycling assistant

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and website. Kaitlyn addressed questions about packaging guidelines and discussed ongoing efforts to clarify recycling rules with transfer station staff.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Chris Bennem and Jeff Liebentritt spoke to the Board:

Hello, and thanks for letting me and Jeff have privilege of the floor tonight to introduce our report on a unique opportunity for South Bristol, the ConnectAll Grant for expanding Broadband.

Jeff and I are two members of the grants working group, speaking in place of our chair, Alyssa Benjamin-Trego who couldn't be here tonight. Our group consists of one member each of the Community Engagement committee, which I chair, the Parks, Rec & Beautification committee, which Jeff co-chairs, and finance where Alyssa serves. Our team is tasked with unearthing and evaluating grant opportunities for the town, and this is one we strongly endorse.

The ConnectAll Office was created by NYS to act on its commitment to digital equity. The grant's been around for two years, but this is the last chance for us to qualify for the remaining ARPA funds. We're here tonight because the deadline for application is April 30 and because unlike most grants, this one would fully fund efforts to close the final gap of unserved and underserved locations in our town.

According to the NYS broadband map, around 12% of South Bristol falls into this category. Thanks to the efforts of this town, the county, our state, and the federal government, all the low-hanging fruit has been served—what's left are places that are the most difficult, and least profitable to provide service to. These are the locations for whom this grant was created. Initial efforts to vet this information has shown that at least some of these locations are getting some kind of service, so we do expect that number to fall somewhat.

The application is a highly technical process requiring the services of engineering, mapping, and other documentation that would be impossible for our team to complete. After consulting with Empire Access we were put in touch with two engineering firms, one of whom estimated just the application process alone would cost around \$75,000 to complete. The other, Hunt Engineering, provided us with a bid for \$24,500. Hunt is an excellent firm, and we think the reason they were able to come in so far under ECC is because of their experience: they helped Livingston County get a ConnectAll grant for \$26.5 million dollars which they are using to wire every unserved household. Dan Marcellus, who spoke at last month's meeting and will be speaking at next week's presentation, has been working on the Livingston project, as has Empire.

Our chances to get this grant are not guaranteed, but they are higher than normal because in addition to the residences we have two Community Anchor Institutions that would be served: the Mees Observatory and the Cumming Nature Center. Jeff will read the Cummings director's comments, and the full list of regional advocates who have agreed to support this effort, but I want to take a moment to thank Bill Wellman, supervisor of Phelps and chair of the Ontario County Board of Supervisors who has been a friend to South Bristol. Thanks so much for your support.

We hope the board will support this application which will bring much needed service to the last stretches of our town. Thank you.

Jeff Liebentritt of St Rt 64, spoke to the Board:

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Good Evening, my name is Jeff Liebentritt and I will be reading comments from Alyssa Benjamin-Trego, the Grants Working Group chair.

As a member of the Town's Grant Committee, with experience supporting grant development for municipal projects, I strongly support pursuing this opportunity. Importantly, this program does not require a local funding match, which is uncommon with grants of this size and makes it a particularly strong opportunity for the Town. This creates a path to pursue substantial outside funding with limited upfront investment.

Based on my review of the program requirements in the Towns identified unserved areas, I believe the Town is a strong candidate for funding. The project directly aligns with the programs goal of expanding broadband access in rural and underserved areas, and the concentration of unserved location presents a clear case for investment. The project area also includes community serving institutions such as the Cumming Nature Center further demonstrating broader public benefit and strengthening overall competitiveness of the application.

While there is a cost to prepare a competitive application, it is modest relative to the potential return. Based on my experience with engineering-related grant work, the proposed cost of appears reasonable for the level of effort required. Given the relatively low cost to apply, the potential for significant funding, I believe it is both reasonable and prudent for the Town to approve.

Mr. Liebentritt said the statement was from Alyssa Benjamin-Trego. Just a little bit about her, she is an engineer with 10 years of civil engineering experience, she worked for 5 years at MRB Group, an engineering and architectural municipal planning firm and a leading agency in the grants world. During her time there, she supported the preparation of numerous grant applications for municipal clients. She is a resident of South Bristol and serves on the Finance Committee.

Mr. Liebentritt continued, this letter of support is from Sarah Jacoby Murphy, the director of Cumming Nature Center.

The Cumming Nature Center switched to Starlink a couple of years ago because we only had one provider option for internet at the time and service was so poor (slow, went out a lot, etc.). We looked into fiber at the time, but the installation fees to run it to the Nature Center were astronomical for us to cover as a non-profit. High-speed, reliable internet is essential to our daily operations, so thankfully, Starlink has provided an okay alternative – but service quality can still vary based on weather and other factors. Fiber would provide a good, reliable internet option for us, and would offer a reasonable alternative to Starlink that is not impacted by the weather.

Sarah Jacoby Murphy, Director, Cumming Nature Center

Mr. Liebentritt continued, letters of support should be forthcoming from Claudia Tenney, our Congresswoman, Pam Helming, our State Senator, Andrea Bailey, our State Assemblywoman, Bill Wellman, Chair of Ontario County Board of Supervisors, Don Cotter, the Supervisor of the Town of Canandaigua, John Cowley, Supervisor of the Town of Naples, Laura Abplanalp, Supervisor of the Town of Bristol, David Baker, Supervisor of City of Canandaigua, Thomas Harvey, Ontario County Planning Director, David Bowen, South Bristol Planning Board Chair. The idea is having these letters of support from community members raises the threshold which should improve the likelihood of the grants approval.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

On a motion made by Councilwoman Meg Fuller and seconded by Councilwoman Jamie Hall, the minutes from the March 9, 2026 Regular Town Board Meeting were ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Moore, Cowley, Fuller, Abraham and Hall.

REPORTS

- Highway/Transfer Station – Councilman Stephen Cowley read the Highway Report. Report included quotes for paving the Overlook; \$12,850.00 for labor and equipment and \$28,989.22 for paving for the Board to review.
- Code Enforcement – Councilman Stephen Cowley read the CEO Report.
- Buildings and Grounds – Councilman Chris Abraham mentioned that the new playground will be installed in the beginning of May.
- IT – Councilwoman Meg Fuller passed around an updated IT Security Policy that includes separate roles for information security and privacy officers and asked for feedback. This is a requirement by the State. The Quarter-one projects for Skyport IT Services are complete. The Quarter-two projects are on hold due to the cost of memory. Councilwoman Meg Fuller explained the next steps for upgrades to the server to 2019 versions. The quote for \$9,690.58 will update the 3 servers and licenses. This cost was included in the 2026 Budget. The .gov website implementation process needs careful planning to avoid disrupting services.

On a motion made by Councilman Stephen Cowley and seconded by Councilwoman Jamie Hall, the quote was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: Moore, Cowley, Fuller, Abraham and Hall.

Citizen Committees:

- Parks, Recreation, and Beautification – Councilman Chris Abraham reported the committee had a meeting recently read a statement from the Committee: *To honor the pride South Bristol residents have in their Town and to recognize the 250th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, the Ad-hoc committee on Parks, Recreation and Beautification would like to make the following recommendations for immediate consideration by the South Bristol Town Board and Highway Superintendent. If we could review the policy for Town Board's sub-committees and if needed add two individuals to the Buildings & Grounds committee/liaison.* Councilman Chris Abraham said he is the Buildings & Grounds liaison, a party of one, and not familiar enough to comment how things were done in the past. If there are guidelines for those additional members that legal merits are met. This will give more oversight on the decisions that are made. The committee is asking to develop policy requiring future projects on town properties on the Town Hall campus, parks and cemeteries to be reviewed by the Buildings & Grounds committee. The first recommendation is the Scenic Overlook to pursue the guidance of a professional landscaper/architect to evaluate safety and aesthetics. Make every effort to

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get free consultation with professionals' response and estimated cost of improvements and expected annual maintenance. Try and get 3 proposals for design. The Town Hall Campus is the Town Hall, playground, basketball court, Veteran's Memorial and newly acquired property with the same criteria. Re-do all South Bristol signs with removal, replacement or repair. Add to the annual list of responsibilities of this Buildings and Grounds committee. Evaluate partnerships and responsibilities for the DEC park in Woodville. The Ad-hoc committee on Parks, Recreation and Beautification seeks the approval of the Town Board to remain active for the remainder of 2026. The next meeting is May 3rd at Noon.

On a motion made by Councilman Chris Abraham and seconded by Councilwoman Meg Fuller, the motion to add 2 members to Buildings & Grounds and for the Ad-Hoc committee to continue through 2026 was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: Moore, Cowley, Fuller, Abraham and Hall.

Councilman Chris Abraham asked Supt. Jim Wight to collaborate on the Buildings & Grounds. Supt. Jim Wight noted that he has worked on Buildings & Grounds for 17 years, that his job here is roads, roadsides, drainage, and culverts. By law, the highway dept. doesn't have to plow the Town Hall parking lot, or mow the grass, same with the Overlook. It always has been, it doesn't have to change.

- Community Engagement: Councilwoman Jamie Hall said the first Community Conversation is happening next week on Broadband and Technology, bringing it to our communities. Suggestion boxes located in the town hall and at the Transfer Station as well as digitally will go to the Committee.
- Finance – Supr. Lisa Moore mentioned ** the 2 action items, that there will be a working group under that umbrella to produce a budget everyone can understand. Also, the Town is supposed to have a Conflict of Interest policy and submitted a draft to the Board.

- Assessor – Supr. Lisa Moore read the Assessor's Report.

On a motion made by Councilman Stephen Cowley and seconded by Councilwoman Meg Fuller, the MMB RFP for \$17,000.00 and move \$6,000.00 into the budget line item was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: Moore, Cowley, Fuller, Abraham and Hall

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- Approval of the Vouchers: On a motion made by Councilwoman Meg Fuller and seconded by Councilwoman Jamie Hall the Abstract totaling \$80,542.27 was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: Moore, Cowley, Fuller, Abraham and Hall.
